In July, talk production was started up in Western United States. The entire system was designed and delivered by REDWAVE. The core is formed by two REDWAVE ROX. The completion and commissioning of the plant has allowed the life of the customer's mine to be extended by 20 years, and as a result has saved it from immediate closure. With this plant, REDWAVE has also been able to make a significant contribution to the efficient use of resources in the USA and, not least of all, help secure around 40 jobs for the customer.

In the summer, glass processing at Sims Municipal Recycling also went into operation. In addition to its outstanding sorting technology, REDWAVE has once again proven that a key strength of the company in the North American continent is its ability to demonstrably supply complete plant systems. The current development of the XRF technology metal recycling business in the United States is particularly pleasing. Four individual machines have already been supplied this year, with more to follow. This is also leveraged by the efforts to further increase service quality in North America.
